

The article "Describing Color Differences," has been selected as the best paper published in the peer reviewed journal of the *AATCC Review* in 2007. The paper, written by Carol Tomasino Revels, was published in January 2007.

The author will be honored with The J. William Weaver Award, a framed certificate signed by the president of AATCC and the chair of the Publications Committee. The Weaver award will be presented to both the 2007 and 2008 winners at the AATCC International Conference, March 10-12, 2009, Hilton Myrtle Beach Resort, Myrtle Beach, S.C., USA.

Revels joined AATCC as a student in 1985. She currently serves as chair of RA36, Color Measurement Test Methods, and chair of the Color Guidebook subcommittee (since 2004). She served as chair of the color symposium in 2001. Revels has also served on the International Test Methods Committee, Technical Committee on Research, Education Advisory Board, Subjects and Speakers Bureau, Electronic Media Subcommittee, and in the Concept 2 Consumer Interest Group. Revels co-authored "A Study to Determine the Need for a Color Guidebook," published in *AATCC Review* in April 2005.

Revels holds a BS in textile chemistry and a Masters degree in Textiles from North Carolina State University. A native of Greensboro, N.C., USA, Revels, her husband Wally and two daughters, Maria and Savannah, live in Miramar, Fla., USA. She began her career in 1986, as a color technologist for Burlington Industries Corp. R&D. She has since worked for Spartan Mills, ShelLyn Inc., and Cone Mills Corp. She is currently the director for global color services for Gap, Inc.
